Library telescopes in Canada

Hello,

I recently re-joined the RASC.

I did so because of the idea of library telescopes.

I read the excellent documentation created by the volunteers at <u>librarytelescope.org</u>, and became interested in the project.

Over the past week or so I've helped out by adding many entries to their database of public libraries in Canada that lend out telescopes.

According to the data I compiled (through Google searches):

- about 243 telescopes are lent out in 100 public library branches across Canada
- about 3.0% of public library branches in Canada loan out library scopes (in the US, the number is about 4.4%)
- hot-spots/early adopters are Québec, Ottawa, the Fraser Valley (BC), and PEI
- places with no library telescopes at all: Manitoba, Toronto, Vancouver, Calgary, and downtown Montreal
- various types of scopes have been used: Orion StarBlast (especially in Québec), SkyWatcher Heritage 76mm (Fraser Valley), SkyWatcher Dobs, and a few others

I thought it would be useful to gather info specific to Canada, so I created this, using <u>github.com</u>, a project collaboration tool:
